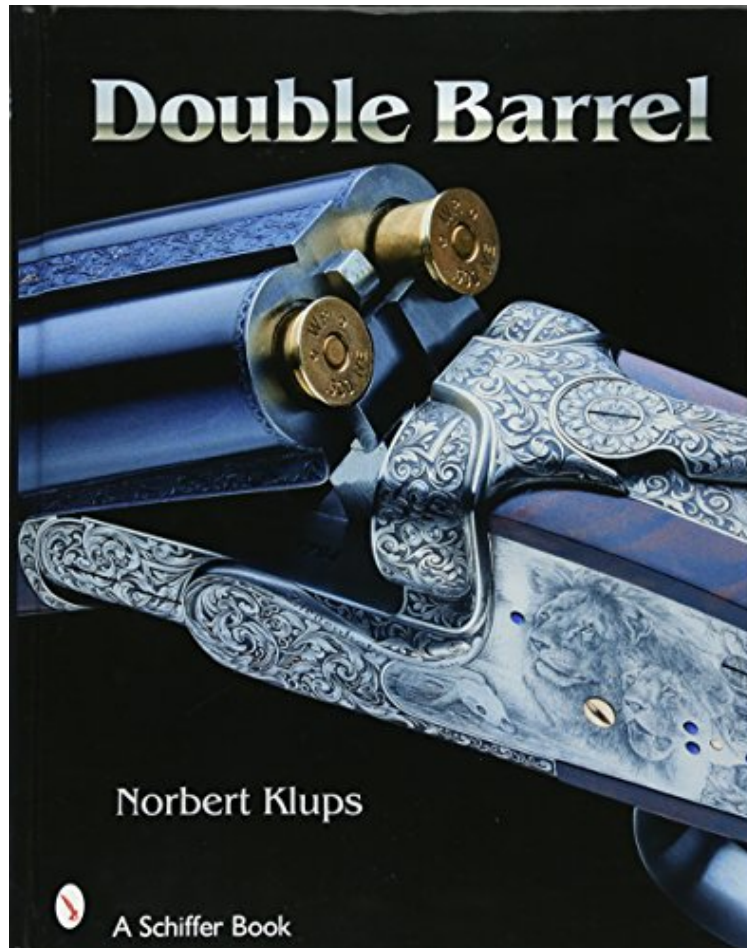

When you open it and look at the excellent topics, the high quality of the design, the quality binding, fancy paper and great photographs, you just cannot help but be impressed. Yes, like all books it cannot be everything for everybody, but on the face of it, it covers material not readily found everywhere. Unfortunately this is a translation from German and whilst the German version must really be a great book, the English version is not. Your second emotion kicks in when you start reading it and find that you can hardly understand the text due to an absolutely shockingly poor translation into English. Sometimes it takes 3-4 readings of a paragraph just to determine which parts

of a double are actually being referred to. I eventually, with great difficulty, created a dictionary of 'terminology used' versus 'terminology needed' just to try and make some sense. These I penned (a sin in itself) into the book out of desperation. After days of struggling to understand the text you will either surrender and settle on looking at photos and captions, or you will have acquired a fair deal of information on European doubles with the greatest effort you have expended since high school advanced maths. If you can read German - buy this book in that language. If not - don't waste your time or money. In all fairness to the author - he did a great job and he is probably just as frustrated with the translated result as its English readers have been. What a pity, as this could have been an important addition to English double rifle literature. I am sorry to say that the proofreading is also a dismal failure i.e. broken sentences repeated sentences very poor word choice etc. The editor should apologize for this book. Other than that it is a visually beautiful book and would be helpful if it was readable. Get the original in German it would be clearer. Again I am sorry to be negative but there has to be minimal standards.
