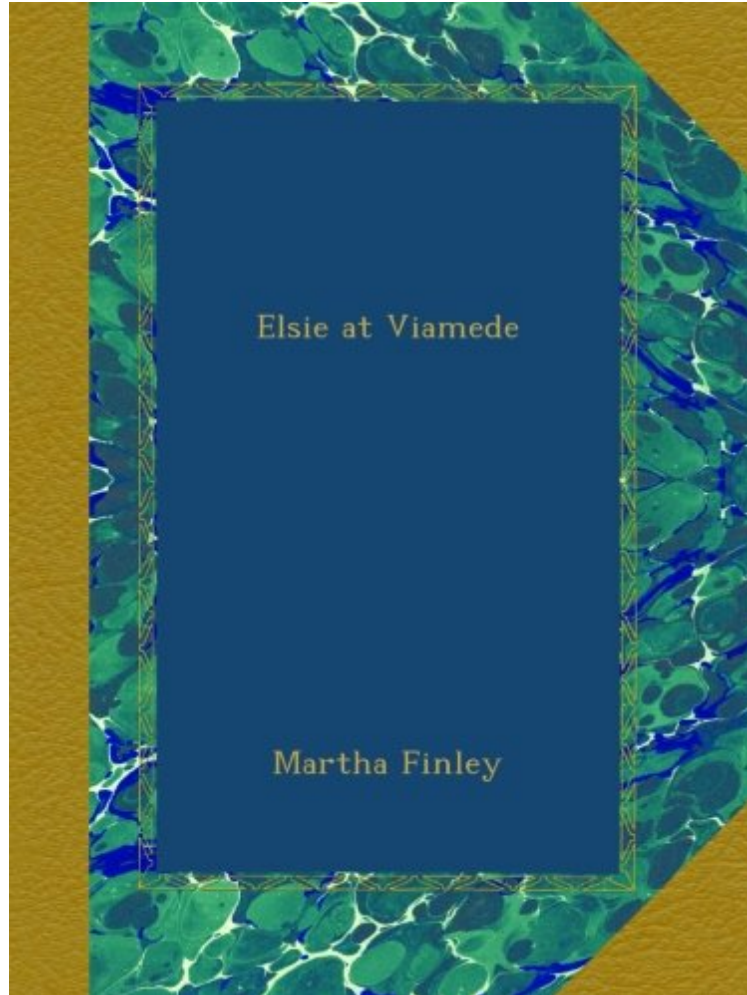

This book was originally published prior to 1923, and represents a reproduction of an important historical work, maintaining the same format as the original work.
