This book (Novel Living: Collecting, decorating and crafting with books by Lisa Occhipinti) was written by a book lover and collector. Her approach is unique in that she shows the many ways books can be displayed in a home. My only disagreement with the author is she does not think it is necessary to read every book in her collection. In this respect I have a different take on this issue. I am also an avid book collector but I have read all of my volumes at least once.

Nevertheless, I think this 144 page volume is not just interesting but is also very informative on how to collect, create and preserve your books. This fully illustrated hard cover book is organized into four chapters. The first chapter covers collecting books and lists places to search for rare volumes. The second chapter explains how to create a library of your favorite books. The third chapter deals with methods to preserve your books. The final chapter covers crafting with books.
