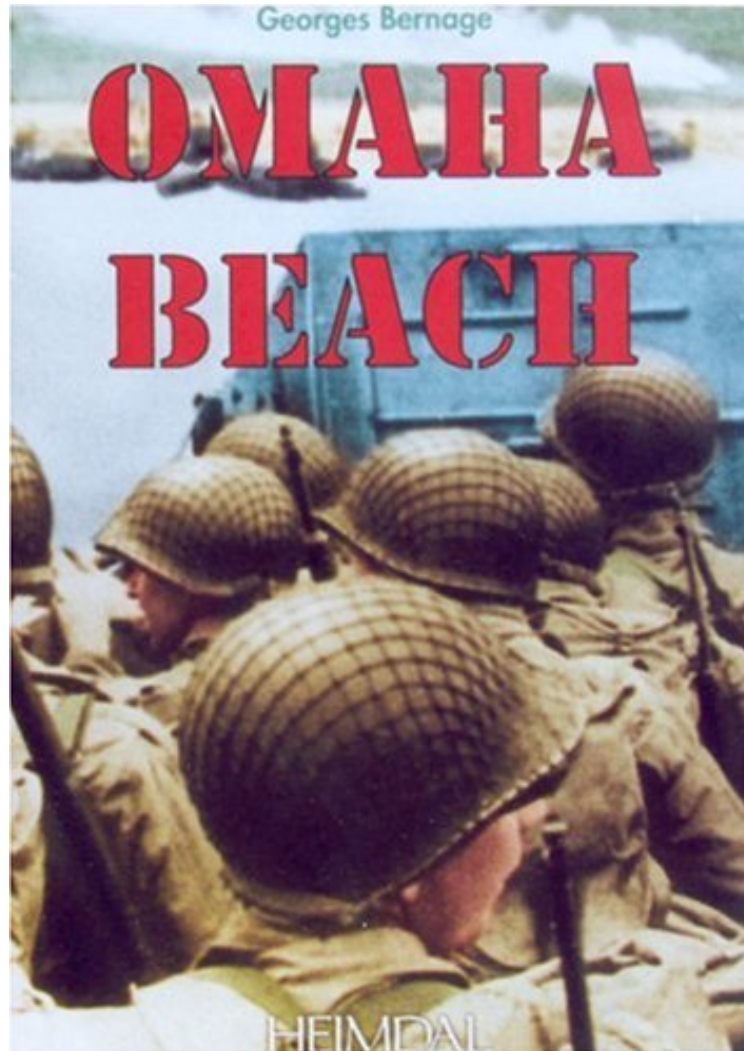

Unfortunately, it suffers too much from sloppy editing. While packed with good information, its pages are also rife with spelling and/or grammatical errors. Some of these mistakes are readily apparent and can be forgiven and overlooked by a knowledgable reader. However, many others involve errors in syntax or missing words which could confuse or misinform persons not already familiar with this part of the D-Day operation. These lapses may have resulted during translation of the text from French to English, but tighter editing of the whole likely would have caught and corrected

most of them prior to publication. One does get a lot of good information for the price in OMAHA BEACH and it proved to be a worthwhile, if somewhat frustrating, read. Note: Upon further consideration and a second reading, I wish to apologize to the author and editor of OMAHA BEACH for some of my initial comments. What I'd characterized as "spelling errors" are actually words bisected by the two-column, newspaper-style formatting used on many pages. Although having to mentally reassemble these combinations can produce a "somewhat choppy" reading experience, it in no way lessens the value of this book's factual content.
