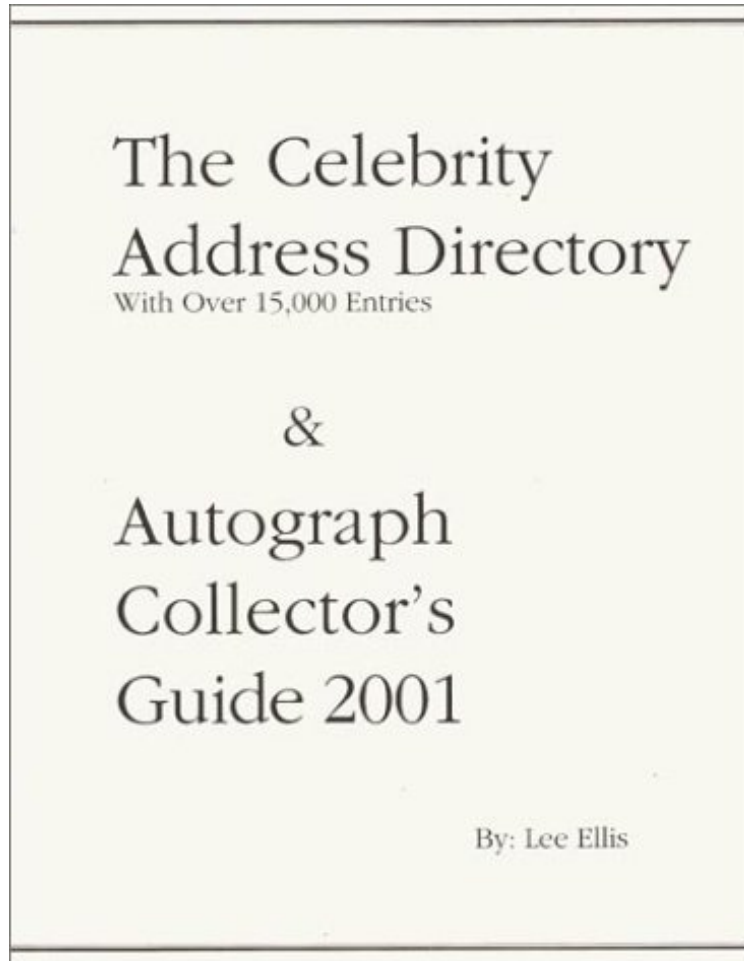

Donovan...and rather misleading - the large quantity of addresses the author claims is due to the fact that a large number of people are "lumped" under a common address - for instance, all Olympic athletes, past and present, are given a generic address of the U.S. Olympic Committee, all members of congress are listed together, all members of a sports team are listed with one address, etc. Much of this "information" can be found for free on the Internet. The book is also poorly organized when compared to others on the market - a straight alphabetical approach would be easier to use. I returned this one day after I bought it - I've found the books by Mark Allen Baker to be better.

This book is an address directory of over 15,000 well-known celebrities in entertainment, sports, business and politics. It also contains the basic information to begin collecting autographs by mail. This book is written with the autograph collector in mind, but the book is useful to anyone who wishes to contact a celebrity by mail.
