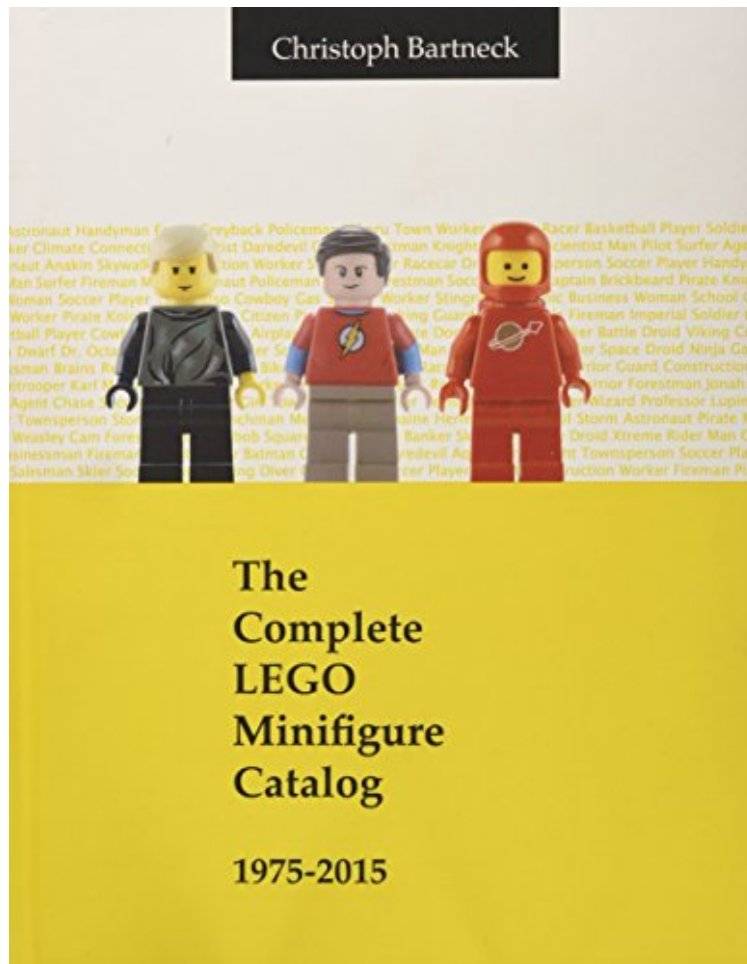

There are over 6,500 full color pictures throughout the book. The book is arranged by theme so all the ninjago figures are together, all the star wars figures are together, etc. The years are shown for each figure so you know when they were released which is nice. One thing we really liked is in the back of the book it shows individual heads and what figure they came with and the page number to see it. My complaints are: many minifigures have helmets on so the face is not shown. This made me have to Google the minifigure to find out what head/face needed to be used. A picture of the back of the figure would also have been nice. The book doesn't show the accessories for many of the figures. Again, a Google search was required. Although the accessories are shown for the minifigure collections through series 14. It also would have been

nice to know what Lego set the minifigures originally came in. All-in-all an excellent reference and should be the first one purchased by anybody that plans on collecting minifigures.
