It is a scary situation for klal Yisroel when the construction of eruvim is undertaken by a community relying on an individual's prowess in installing a stick and string in the ground. The situation you encountered with older eruvim becoming posule or worse, posule from day one, should give cause to the local rabbis to tremble with fear. A case in point just occurred in my own neighborhood, of which I am not included in TheEruv. People carried out of TheEruv and up to my Farm carrying their children, and belongings to visit the farm. Now, they thought the eruv was extended because they saw that there was an additional "doorway" installed. No, they were terribly mistaken and they had passed right pass the sign "Eruv stops here" to visit the Farm. This last week I painted the street with signage reading NO ERUV. It seems some got the idea. However, this did not take away all of the other shaylos in eruvim that they chose to ignore: 1 questionable validity of the skeeros Rashus, The main road is mefoolash anad larger than 16 amos, and there is a huge karfeef in the middle of the eruv where nobody can traverse without machetes, tall boots, and proper clothing to protect from the

thorns and overgrowth in the area. Sad day when they decided to build this eruv.,
