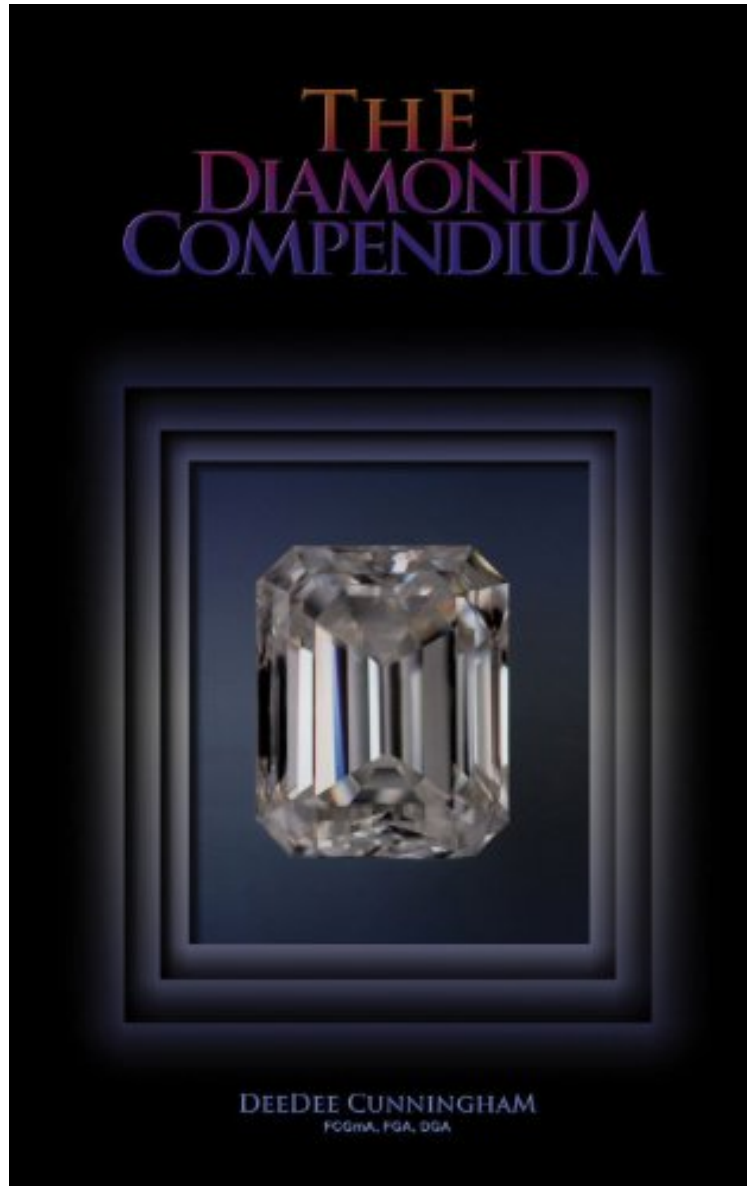

Expensive, I'll concede that, but substantially expensive to produce due to the sheer volume of content (888 pages!) and number of quality photos throughout. So don't expect it to ever get discounted much more than the fifty some dollar price reduction on as of the fall of 2011 (which is a bargain as I paid the full price shown of \$225 when it first hit, yet I still think it was reasonably priced all considered). If it goes even lower grab it, but you might want to consider grabbing it now as the production cost is so high that inflation will make it impractical to reprint in its present pristine form. This is a very impressive work. At first it may seem a little intimidating at 894 pages but clearly the author's intent was not to intimidate but to educate. One also realizes that DeeDee Cunningham is not only a master of diamonds but also a powerful and talented writer. This makes a big difference in the enjoyment of a book, since good information in a dry, dull form can be difficult to read (remember trying to keep your eyes open while reading a dull textbook? even in a subject of interest?). On the other hand, interesting information presented in an organized manner with a natural flow make this book a pleasure to read. The author's ability to make even the complicated aspects of diamond (colored diamond's atomic chemistry for one stand out) seem clear through good solid explanations with proper illustrations makes it a most impressive work. The sheer range of topics covered make it able to take the place of at least a handful of other books and journals which come to mind. Diamond grading is completely covered in four chapters, one on each of the 4 C's. I can't imagine ever needing to know more than is presented here. The same is true with the crystal section and identification. I have read a couple other books on synthetic diamonds and in the end, obviously whole books are able to have a greater volume of information, but at over 80 pages the chapter on synthetics is for certain the best summary written on the subject. There is no filler just the history, the science, and the facts. I have heard this said about the chapter on diamond manufacturing (cutting) as well. Many of the chapters are really capable of being standalone works. This is a book that has, and will continue to have, a lasting value to me as a reference. It is also a beautiful book visually as well because of the many high quality graphics and photographs.
